

**NORTH CRAWFORD SCHOOL DISTRICT  
REGULAR BOARD MEETING  
NOVEMBER 19, 2015**

Upon obtaining verification that the meeting had been properly noticed Board President Mary Kuhn called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Board members present included Wade Dull, Jim Dworschack, Aaron Fortney, Mary Kuhn, Terry O'Donnell, and Judy Powell. Absent: Jesse Swenson. Also present were Administrator Dan Davies, Principal Brandon Munson, Special Education Director Pat Wenske, Business Manager Demetri Andrews, and the local press.

New Business

Jim Dworschack shared his thoughts and ideas regarding building community and communication that led to Board discussions. A motion was made but failed due to the lack of a second.

A motion was made by Dull, seconded by O'Donnell, to postpone Neola recommendations for Board policy revisions. Motion carried.

Minutes

The minutes of the October 29, 2015 Regular Board Meeting was approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report and Voucher's Payable Listing

The board reviewed the disbursements listing of \$585,856.10 including the November 5 and November 20 payrolls and the payables at this meeting of \$503,997.29. The Treasurer's Report and Statement of Extra-Curricular Accounts were approved as presented without objection.

Public Input

Charlie Preusser discussed the lack of bus drivers and reasons versus solutions.

Administration Reports

Administrator Davies discussed a multitude of topics with the Board: energy audit, lighting considerations, AP classes, well water issues and a stem grant was being sought.

Business Manager Andrews informed the Board that Skyward Financial is going live January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 and all staff will be able to go online.

Special Education Director Wenske informed the Board that her staff was doing Skyward training, Mrs. Lown assisted with testing, herself and the guidance counselor was completing a course on disciple and mental health issues and have already started implementing the information learned, and the special education audit was ongoing monthly.

Principal Munson informed the Board the state was mandating in the 2016-17 school year a 100 question civics exam and the social studies department was working on developing a curriculum for it. The math department is also working on curriculum.
